#### (1) SOS Candidates' Survey for Election 2014:

SOS has sent out a Candidates' Survey on planning issues to each party and independent candidate (where known). The comprehensive survey is being conducted online via SurveyMonkey, which will do most of the analysis of the responses.

The results will be publicised a few weeks before the election. Community groups that are publicly supporting the survey will share the detailed results. The more groups that support the survey, the more likely candidates and the media are to respond.

**Guest speaker Professor Brendan Gleeson**, *Professor of Urban Policy Studies and* 

Director of the Melbourne Sustainable Society Institute at Melbourne University

Modern capitalist society has provided our present high standard of living but now also brings challenges and threats, especially climate change, resource depletion, social division and economic insecurity.

So how can we plan for a more resilient city designed to meet these challenges and maintain our residential amenity within sustainable limits? Economic and population growth cannot continue indefinitely – what sort of political, social and economic system might we need to move towards?

And how could the community play more of a role in these issues?

Professor Gleeson has researched and written extensively on the wellbeing of our cities and suburbs and the political, social, economic and environmental trends shaping Australia. Come and hear him discuss these issues and answer your questions.

### (8) Be vigilant! Unscrupulous developers are failing to erect advertising signs

Residents in some suburbs have noticed an increasing trend of development applicants failing to erect yellow planning signs (or putting them up for just a day or so), relying on the fact that council officers don't do site checks. This obviously reduces objections so lobby your council to conduct random site checks for (say) 1 in 10 applications, coupled with prosecution for false declarations.
